WASHINGTON, DC (January 28, 2025) – Today, the Coalition for America's Gateways and Trade Corridors (CAGTC) extends congratulations to Secretary Sean Duffy on his confirmation as the 20th U.S. Secretary of Transportation. CAGTC Executive Director Elaine Nessle offered the following statement:

"CAGTC congratulates Secretary Duffy on his swift confirmation to lead the U.S. Department of Transportation. He will direct the Department at an important time, implementing the remaining two years of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, and charting a course for the next surface transportation reauthorization. During his confirmation hearing, Secretary Duffy shared the new Administration's goal to invest in large, durable projects that connect the nation and commerce. CAGTC shares this goal and is eager to work with Secretary Duffy to ensure that nationally and regionally significant freight projects are advanced swiftly and funded robustly.
